Design Processes



Interior Design Processes

- Provides general design direction including any standards that need to be followed
- Completed by Planner with input from PD&C Interior Design Team
- Routed for approval internally

PMP

Design

- Consultant design team works through the evolution of the design (SD, DD and CD)
- May include reviews with PD&C Workgroup

- Review at key milestones as agreed upon in the design consultant's workplan
- Agree upon comments to be incorporated into the design prior to completion of DDs

IRC

Approvals

• Additional levels of approval are needed based on priority of project






Project Management Plan (PMP)



- Completed by PD&C Planner prior to starting a project
- Intended to define the scope of the project
- Provided to the architect and engineer as the basis for their fee proposals and workplans
- Control mechanism for managing changes and scope creep

Interior Design Approval Process

- Once a Project Management Plan (PMP) has been routed for final internal approval it will then be reviewed by the Interior Design Manager to determine if the project requires review by the Interiors Review Committee (IRC).
- BJC Sr. Interior Designer will then send an email to the BJC Planner, BJC PM, AOR, and EOR to formally notify them that their project will require IRC review.
- Based on the projects design work plan, the Sr. Interior Designer will then
 determine which standing IRC meeting will be assigned to that project for review.
 Reviews are typically held during the Design Development phase of a project and
 should occur prior to Design Development completion.



The IRC is a multidisciplinary body of representatives from various departments who will meet regularly to review capital construction projects to provide relevant feedback from their unique perspectives. The IRC is an important step in the design review process that helps to maintain the appearance of our facilities and ensures that new projects adhere to each facility's design story and standards.

- □ All projects will be reviewed internally within PD&C (PD&C Workgroup) to ensure adherence to interior standards, HSO design story, and project objectives as identified in the PMP.
- □ Some projects will then be presented to the Interiors Review Committee (IRC). This group is comprised of enterprise level and HSO representatives to provide multidisciplinary input on the design.
- ☐ Lastly projects deemed "high profile" will be presented to leadership for final approval (HSO Approval Committee).

If the design team runs into challenges finding a successful design solution, a peer review process will be utilized leveraging the experience of the Interior Design Advisory Council (IDAC).



PD&C Workgroup

Responsibilities:

- To review Architect/Interior
 Design proposal for adherence
 to interior standards, HSO
 specific design story, and
 project objectives
- To determine whether design package is ready to be presented to the Interiors Review Committee

Interiors Review Committee

Responsibilities:

- To review the design proposal and provide relevant feedback to the design team from the perspective of each representative
- To make a recommendation for consideration by the HSO Approval Committee
- The IRCs can also be utilized to provide input on the evolution of standards and the testing of new products.

HSO Approval Committee

Responsibilities:

- To evaluate design proposal for adherence to HSO's Interior Design Philosophy
- To approve final project design proposal



There are four IRC's established, dividing the HSOs for efficiency to align with the Facilities organizational structure. The IRCs are scheduled once per quarter as a placeholder. If there are no new projects to review at that time, the meeting occurrence will be cancelled.





Interior Design Approval Process

PD&C Workgroup

Most projects will only require this level of review and approval.

IDAC Peer Review

Interiors Review Committee

New freestanding buildings, significant renovation of a public space (lobbies, waiting rooms, cafeterias, etc), significant renovation of a nursing unit (over 50%, patient rooms, PCS's, etc).

IDAC Peer Review

HSO Approval Committee

Board level projects and any projects deemed 'high-profile' require review and approval of the HSO president and/or group president.



Interiors Design Advisory Council (IDAC)

- Council consisting of primarily external consultants volunteering to advise BJC on topics regarding interior design on capital construction projects.
 - Performance of interior finish materials troubleshoot existing installations and advise on proposed new products and materials
 - Recommendation of interior finish standards to be implemented across projects
 - Peer review interior design concepts for high profile projects (include Donna Ware, D&I and/or Patient Experience, and/or Public Safety and/or PFAC)
- Format will be primarily through email correspondence however group may be convened to discuss a topic in greater detail or to review a mock-up or performance test.

- User Experience

Consultant design teams should use the campus design stories to ensure a cohesive, purposeful design that aligns with the overall campus feel.

Standard Finish Palettes

Design Stories

Unique to each individual hospital

Use primarily when matching existing conditions

Our BJC

Derived from the BJWC palette and to be applied across other hospitals in public facing spaces

BJC Medical Group

Used for projects identified as outpatient centers

Includes exterior architectural and signage standards

For Med Group TI – interior finishes only if all new

Equipment Rooms

Builds on the BJWC palette and to be applied across other hospitals equipment rooms where significant finish work is needed

Our BJC Core Values

Located in office buildings such as the Commons, MCC and COH

Some staff spaces in hospitals

SLCH

Unique to pediatric spaces.

Follows the Interior Design
Vision created in early
2024.

Includes SLCH hospital space and 'off campus' spaces such as CSCCs.

<u>Pharmacies</u>

Based on the Our BJC palette but adjusted to address the unique needs of a pharmacy setting.

Primarily used at off campus locations.

Behavioral Health

Based on the Our BJC palette but adjusted to address the unique needs of behavioral health.

Primarily used at off campus locations where outpatient services are provided.




Exterior Design

Exterior Design Approval Process

The review process for exterior and site design on capital projects is a tiered approach determined during the PMP process based on the significance of the project.

Most projects will be reviewed and approved at the project level – primarily small additions that need to match the existing campus architecture. There may be occasion on larger or more prominent projects for a hospital president to review and approve a design. The final level may involve a BJC group president to review and approval.



Architectural Review Committee

- Council consisting of internal leadership and external consultants volunteering to advise BJC on the development of exterior architectural design concepts for high profile projects.
- Review material selections and aesthetic mockups to inform recommendations.
- Format will be primarily through meetings where design architect presents design and peer reviewers provide commentary.
- Consider including D&I and/or Patient Experience and/or Marketing & Communications (branding).
