



MyChart Proxy Application for Minor Patients - Age 0-11

Completing this form allows someone else (a "proxy") to be able to access a patient's health record via MyChart. To request proxy access, please complete this form and return it to a staff member or to the fax number or email address below. One application is required for each proxy request.

I understand that as a proxy:

- I must log into my MyChart account with my own username and password to access the patient's information.
- BJC HealthCare/Washington University may revoke access to this electronic access at any time deemed appropriate.
- When the patient turns 12, access will be automatically adjusted to limited registration and scheduling information for some departments to protect adolescent privacy.

PARENT WITH A CHILD AGE 0-11 YEARS

Parent/guardian access via MyChart will be revoked when:

• Parent/guardian submits a request to revoke online access.

Parent/guardian proxy access will be changed from full access to limited access when the patient turns 12.

- Parent/guardian can request full MyChart proxy access by filling out a form, but only with the consent of the adolescent patient following a conversation with their provider.
- When the patient turns 12, access will be adjusted to limited to protect adolescent privacy.

I attest that I am a parent or guardian with the right to access my child's protected health information. If I am no longer a parent or guardian with legal authority to access my child's account, I will immediately stop using my proxy access through MyChart, and I will alert the MyChart support team to turn off my access.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT MYCHART PROXY ACCESS

What is proxy access used for (ages 0-11)?

Proxy access for this age range gives parents and guardians access to information for their children. Through proxy access, parents and guardians can keep track of vaccination records, growth charts, test results, diagnoses, and medical instructions, communicate with a child's care team, schedule certain appointments, and much more.

When will I lose proxy access to my child's MyChart account?

When the child turns 12 years old, parents and guardians who previously had full proxy access to the child receive limited access instead. Before the child's 12th birthday, you will receive reminder notifications in MyChart about these upcoming changes. To regain full proxy access to your adolescent child's information, you will have to complete a separate application form at that time.
